# BYC Racing Rules

## 1 ORGANIZING AUTHORITY

The Organizing Authority for the races described in this Racing Guide is the Beverly Yacht Club.

## 2 GOVERNING RULES

All BYC racing series and events will be governed by the current Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) except as changed by the BYC Sailing Instructions and this Racing Guide. All competitors are reminded of the importance of compliance with RRS 68(c) in any BYC racing event.

This Guide is the Notice of Race required by the RRS. In addition, certain race management protocols and schedules that normally appear in the Sailing Instructions are included in this Guide.

The Racing Rules of Sailing are provided by US SAILING to all US SAILING members. Additional copies may be purchased at the BYC Office. The BYC Racing Guide is available at no cost to all BYC members. The Guide is available for sale to non-BYC members at the BYC Office. One waterproof copy of the Sailing Instructions is available for each enrolled racing yacht. Additional copies of the waterproof Sailing Instructions are available for sale at the BYC Office.

## 3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

BYC and non-BYC yachts are eligible to participate in any event or series. Consult the race description pages in this Guide to determine any special eligibility requirements and entry requirements for a series or an individual race.

Use the appropriate form in the back of this Guide to enter a series or regatta, to enroll a BYC yacht not listed in the BYC Yearbook, or to change the name of the person in charge of a BYC yacht. Race results for a yacht will be assigned to the owner unless the BYC Person-in-Charge Form (see Appendix C of this Guide) for a series or individual race is completed and submitted to the BYC Office.

Non-BYC yachts may participate in designated BYC series or races if they have submitted the appropriate form(s) and paid the appropriate fee to the BYC Office prior to the series or race.

### 3.1 HANDICAP YACHTS

*All yachts, including BYC yachts, participating in PHRF races must submit a BYC Series Entry Form and/or a BYC Special Races and Regatta Entry Form (see Appendix C of this Guide) with a copy of a current, valid, and signed PHRF-NE rating certificate.*

Yachts with other rating certificates may apply to the club measurer for an unofficial rating. A yacht with a provisional certificate or unofficial rating must submit to the Race Committee a request in writing for permission to participate in a handicap race or series. The Race Committee, at its sole discretion, may allow or not allow a yacht with a provisional certificate or unofficial rating to participate in a race or series.

For handicap events sponsored by the Beverly Yacht Club, RRS 52 is amended as provided for under RRS 86.1(c) as follows: Competitors are permitted to use electrically-powered winches for running rigging while racing, *except* for Buzzards Bay Regatta.

PHRF-NE crew/weight limits will apply to all PHRF yachts. See the PHRF-NE website for a current list of crew weight limits by boat length (<http://www.phrfne.org/weight.htm>).

Competitors in handicap races are requested to remove anchors from their bow pulpits while racing.

Most events offer Racing (Spinnaker) and Cruising (Non-Spinnaker) classes. The Race Committee may, at its discretion, divide or consolidate entries into divisions based on the number of entries.

To enable the BYC Race Committee to (1) prepare scratch sheets for the handicap fleet, and (2) break large classes into divisions, it is helpful if every handicap yacht owner intending to race submits to the BYC Office a completed BYC Series Entry Form and/or a BYC Special Races and Regatta Entry Form well in advance of the events in which he/she will participate. These Entry Forms are in Appendix C of this Guide.

### **3.2 ONE-DESIGN YACHTS**

One-design yachts which comply with their respective class rules are eligible to race in the appropriate one-design class races. Current class rules are available from the appropriate BYC Fleet Representative.

BYC one-design yachts listed in the BYC Yearbook are automatically entered in appropriate series races. BYC one-design yachts not listed in the BYC Yearbook, must fill out the Member Yacht Enrollment Form in Appendix C and submit it to the BYC office.

## **4 INSPECTION**

Yachts competing are subject to inspection and/or measurement by the Club Measurer, Fleet Measurer, Race Committee Chairperson, or Race Officer at any time.

## **5 SCORING**

This Beverly Yacht Club scoring system replaces Appendix A of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

### **5.1 RACE SCORING**

#### **5.1.1 Races to be Scored**

A race shall be *scored* (1) if it is not abandoned; and (2) if at least three boats start; and (3) if one boat sails the course in compliance with RRS 28.1 and finishes within the time limit, if any, even if she retires after finishing or is disqualified. This changes RRS 90.3(a). A race is *completed* if and only if it is scored. As a courtesy, the race committee will run a race for a class when two boats are prepared to start; however, this race shall not count towards a series or event score.

#### **5.1.2 Establishing the Finish Order**

When there is no handicap system, the race committee shall record the finishing order.

When a handicap system applies, the race committee shall:

- (a) Record the finishing time to the nearest second for each boat that *finished*.
- (b) Calculate the time elapsed from the time of the boat's starting signal to her finishing time.
- (c) Apply the handicap system to produce a corrected time, rounding decimal seconds to the nearer whole number, 0.5 and greater being rounded to the larger whole number.
- (d) Rank the boats in order of corrected times.

When the Sailing Instructions specify a time limit, the race committee will identify any boat not *finishing* within it.

#### **5.1.3 Race Scores**

Each boat *starting* and *finishing* in a race and not thereafter retiring or being disqualified shall be scored points equal to its finish place, i.e.,

<i>Finishing place</i>	<i>Points</i>
First	1
Second	2
Third	3

Fourth	4
<i>Each place thereafter</i>	<i>Add 1 point</i>

Other boats in the race and series shall be recorded and scored according to the following table.

A boat is counted as a race participant only if she sails in the starting area and is recorded as a race participant by the on-the-water race committee.

A boat is counted as a series participant only if she starts in at least one race.

#### **5.1.4 Guidance on Redress**

If the Protest Committee decides to give redress by adjusting a boat’s score, it should consider scoring her

- (a) points equal to the average, to the nearest tenth of a point (0.05 to be rounded upward), of her points in all the races in a series except the race in question, or
- (b) points equal to the average, to the nearest tenth of a point (0.05 to be rounded upward), of her points in all the races before the race in question, or
- (c) points based on the position of the boat at the time of the incident that justifies the redress.

#### **5.1.5 Adjustments to Places and Points**

If a boat is disqualified from a race or retires after *finishing*, each boat that *finished* after her shall be moved up one place.

If the Protest Committee decides to give redress by adjusting a boat’s score, the scores of other boats shall not be changed unless the Protest Committee decides otherwise.

#### **5.1.6 Race Ties**

If boats are tied at the finishing line or if a handicap system is used and boats have equal corrected times, the points for the place for which the boats have tied and for the place(s) immediately below shall be added together and divided equally. Boats tied for a prize shall share it or receive equal prizes.

### **5.2 SERIES SCORING**

#### **5.2.1 Number of Races and Series Scores**

The number of races per day is in the series descriptions. If fewer than 50% of the scheduled races in a series are completed, the completed races and the series shall be abandoned, and no series prizes will be awarded.

The number of races in which a boat must compete to qualify for a series is shown in the table below. A boat will not be considered to have competed in a race if she receives a DNC or DNS score; otherwise she will be considered to have competed.

Each boat's series score shall be the total of her race scores excluding her worst scores for the number of races shown in the table below. However, when she is scored DNE, that score shall count and her next-worse score shall be excluded. If a boat has two or more equal worst scores, the score for the race(s) sailed earliest in the series shall be excluded.

The boat with the lowest series score wins. The next lowest score gets second and so forth.

### **5.2.2 Series Ties**

If there is a series score tie between two or more boats, each boat's race scores shall be listed in the order of best to worst. At the point(s) where there is a difference, the tie shall be broken in favor of the boat(s) with the best score. No excluded scores will be used.

If a tie remains it shall be broken in favor of the boat that scored better than the other boat in more races. If more than two boats are tied, they shall be ranked in order of the number of times each boat scored better than another of the tied boats. No race for which a tied boat's score has been excluded shall be used.

If a tie still remains between two or more boats, they shall be ranked in order of their scores in the last race. Any remaining ties shall be broken by using the tied boats' scores in the next-to-last race and so on until all ties are broken. These scores shall be used even if some of them are excluded scores.

## 6 PROTEST HEARINGS

The following schedule of protest hearings identifies the date for hearings for specific races.

Note: This hearing schedule may be adjusted based on racing schedule changes or conflicts.

Protest hearings will begin at 1700 on the dates shown in the table. Except for the deliberations of the Protest Committee, hearings are open to everyone except witnesses. This rule constitutes the notification required by RRS 63.2.

## **7 PRIZES**

### **7.1 SERIES PRIZES**

Any BYC yacht owner who participates in the BYC racing program has a responsibility to support the program. Therefore, for a BYC yacht to qualify for series prizes, the member in charge or a qualified representative who is a BYC member must serve on the on-the-water race committee for at least one BYC-sponsored event each calendar year. If no race committee slots are available, a member can fulfill this requirement by placing his or her name on the alternate race committee list kept by the Race Officer Captain. The BYC Race Committee will be the sole determiner if a yacht has fulfilled this requirement.

Prizes shall be awarded for each series as follows:

1st prize	Minimum of 3 boats qualifying
2nd prize	Minimum of 4 boats qualifying
3rd prize	Minimum of 7 boats qualifying
4th prize	Minimum of 10 boats qualifying
5th prize	Minimum of 15 boats qualifying

### **7.2 SPECIAL PRIZES**

The following special prizes shall also be awarded.

#### **7.2.1 S. Wiley Wakeman Memorial Trophy**

The S. Wiley Wakeman Memorial Trophy is awarded to the winner of the Shields race on Labor Day.

#### **7.2.2 Tiffany Bucket**

The Tiffany Bucket is awarded to the Shields with the fastest sailing time from Marion to Edgartown for the Edgartown Regatta. The time is measured from Centerboard Shoals off Bird Island to N8 off the Edgartown lighthouse. The Shields Fleet Captain determines the conditions for measuring the time and the winner.

#### **7.2.3 Burgess Allison Edwards Memorial Trophy**

The Burgess Allison Edwards Memorial Trophy is awarded to the skipper with the best overall score in the Shields Championship (Saturday) Series, having qualified in all the series sailed each year.

#### **7.2.4 Sherburne Memorial Bowl**

The Sherburne Memorial Bowl was given to the Beverly Yacht Club by Kathy Saltonstall and Sis Morse. The award was reinstated in 1977 at the kind invitation of Kathy Saltonstall and is competed for annually. A trophy is awarded to the BYC skipper in each fleet, H-12 and Bullseye. The skippers must have qualified in the July and August Thursday Ladies' Series and have the best combined score in the July and August Thursday Ladies' Series. Scoring for the Sherburne Memorial Bowl July and August series will use the same method used to determine any series winners as described in Section 6.

#### **7.2.5 Beverly Cup**

The Beverly Cup is awarded to the yacht with the best overall (average) score in any regular one-design series. In addition, the winner must qualify in the series. The scores to be used in computing the averages are the same as those used to determine the series winners. In case two or more yachts have the same average score, the yacht racing in the actively racing larger fleet wins.

**7.2.6 Laura Bartlett Moore Bowl**

The Laura Bartlett Moore Bowl is awarded by a committee of three, chaired by the H-12 Fleet Representative, to the Ladies’ H-12 crew member and club member who typifies Laurie’s qualities of seamanship, sportsmanship, helpfulness and good humor, in light air or a full gale.

**7.2.7 Nelson Gifford Cup**

The Nelson Gifford Cup is awarded to the yacht that wins the Nelson Gifford race held during the Beverly Yacht Club annual cruise.

**7.2.8 Nora Cudahy Trophy**

The Nora Cudahy Trophy is awarded to the skipper with the best combined score in the June, July, and August Ladies’ H-12 Series.

**7.2.9 Sportsmanship Trophy**

The Sportsmanship trophy is awarded to the person or persons who, in the opinion of the Race Committee Chairperson, best exemplify the tradition of sportsmanship at the Beverly Yacht Club.

**7.2.10 William G. Saltonstall Trophy**

The William G. Saltonstall Trophy is given by his daughter, Joey, other members of the family, and many good friends in recognition of Bill’s love for sailing, his joy in doing it with his family, and his contributions to racing at the Beverly Yacht Club, where he contributed with enthusiasm and pleasure in his H-12 or yawl, Arbella, for more than 50 years! This trophy is awarded to Beverly Yacht Club’s Champion of Champions.

**7.2.11 Visitor’s Trophy**

The United States Finn Association presented this Visitor’s Trophy to the Beverly Yacht Club. It is awarded each year to the club member who, in the opinion of the Commodore, does the most to advance national and international sailing competition.

**7.2.12 Dr. John H. Cunningham Memorial Trophy**

This trophy is given in memory of Dr. John H. Cunningham by his immediate family. In the past, it has been given to 110s, Tempests, and Shields. Since 1976 the trophy has been awarded to the Laser fleet. This year it will be awarded to the winner of the Laser Spring Series.

**7.2.13 The Peggy Dyer Trophy**

The Peggy Dyer Trophy was created by the Bullseye Fleet in 2001 and given by the Dyer family. It is awarded to a senior member of the Beverly Yacht Club family who reflects Peggy’s dedication to the club, love of sailing, and zest for life. In consultation with Bullseye Fleet members and Captain, past recipients and the Dyer family, the Race Chair will name the consensus candidate.

**7.2.14 Mark S. Tirrell Memorial Trophy**

The Mark S. Tirrell Trophy is awarded to the Shields with the best combined score in all the Twilight Series, which Mark loved so well. The winner must qualify in all the Twilight Series sailed each year and have the low point total score for 80% of the races sailed in the series.

**7.2.15 Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy**

The Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy was first awarded in 1896, in memory of George Griswold Van Rensselaer. The Van Rensselaer Trophy is awarded to the winner of a pursuit race with staggered starts for one-design and PHRF fleets.

**7.2.16 Thacher Family Trophy**

The Thacher Family Trophy is awarded to the first Shields crossing the finish line in the Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy Race.

**7.2.17 Goodwin Thacher Trophy**

The Goodwin-Thacher Trophy is awarded to the winner in a race for Bullseyes on Van Rensselaer Day.

**7.2.18 Mary C. B. Cumming Memorial Trophy**

The Mary C. B. Cumming Memorial Trophy is awarded to the winner in a race for H-12s on Van Rensselaer Day.

**7.2.19 Buzzards Bay PHRF Trophy**

The Buzzards Bay PHRF Trophy is awarded to any Buzzards Bay PHRF yacht which has the best combined score in three of the following seven races:

- Mattapoissett Spring Round the Bay Race
- Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy Race
- Parker Converse Tower Race
- Sou' wester Regatta
- Quissett Round the Bay Race
- Mattapoissett Fall Round the Bay Race
- BYC Hurricane Cup

A boat must race in at least three of the seven races to be eligible for the prize. Each boat's race score shall be her finish position score (as described in Section 6) divided by the number of boats in her division. Each boat's series score shall be the total of her three lowest race scores. The lowest total points wins.

**8 SOCIAL EVENTS**

Competitors, including non-BYC members, are encouraged to get together informally at BYC before and/or after racing on race days when the Club is open. Food and beverage service is available according to the BYC calendar.

Please remember that no food or beverages may be brought from the outside for consumption at BYC. Food and beverages are not to be consumed on BYC launches.

# **Tuesday Evening Women's Keelboat Racing Program**

## **General**

Races for women in J/24s are held on Tuesday evenings throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. The purpose of the program is to encourage the participation of all-woman crews in learning how to race performance keelboats. Multiple races are scheduled each Tuesday evening.

MAIN, SMALL JIB AND SPINNAKER ARE PERMITTED.

## **Eligibility**

Races are scheduled for women in J/24s. Participants may be either BYC members or guests, provided they have registered for the program and have paid a participation fee for borrowed-boat insurance and damage deposit. The fee is to be paid by each and every participant, including owners and owners' representatives.

## **Start**

The first warning signal will be at 1800 in the outer harbor.

## **Courses**

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather, the available light, and the judgment of the race committee.

## **Prizes**

The intent of the program is to encourage learning and building of racing experience on the water. Accordingly, daily prizes will not be awarded during the program. A Woman's Keelboat Regatta will be held for program participants at the end of the regular program. Regatta prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Wednesday Twilight Series

## **General**

Races for PHRF classes are held each Wednesday evening throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. Up to three series are held: June, July and August.

## **Eligibility**

All yachts must comply with eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.)

*Classes:* There will be PHRF Racing (Spinnaker) and PHRF Cruising (Non-Spinnaker) classes. Any handicap boat intending to race in the Wednesday Twilight Series must notify the Race Committee whether she plans to race with or without a spinnaker by 1800 on the Thursday one week prior to the start of each series. If a boat switches PHRF classes during a series, she shall be eligible to win a series award for any class in which she has sufficient qualifying races. Class flags for the PHRF classes will be numeral pennants and the appropriate pennant shall be flown from the stern of each yacht from the warning signal until the yacht finishes.

Class assignments will be determined and posted on the official notice board before the start of the first race in each series.

## **Start and Number of Races**

The first warning signal will be at 1800 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). One race will be held each evening for each PHRF class.

## **Courses**

PHRF Racing classes will have windward/leeward or around-the-buoys courses. PHRF Cruising classes will have around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses. Distances will vary with the weather, the available light, and the judgment of the race committee.

## **Prizes**

Daily prizes will be awarded after racing. Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Thursday Ladies' Series

## General

Races for women in the Bullseye and H-12 classes are held on Thursday afternoons throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. Up to three series are held: June, July and August. One series race is held each afternoon for each class. A second non-series and non-scored *crew* race is also held for each class. The on-the-water race committee may, at its sole discretion, run a third, non-series and non-scored race with spinnakers optional.

SPINNAKERS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

## Eligibility

Races are scheduled for women in the Bullseye and H-12 classes.

Yachts listed in the current BYC Yearbook are entered automatically. All others shall file an entry form that can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. The skipper shall have reached her 18th birthday by the end of the calendar year of the current racing season. The crew must be female and may be of any age. The number of crew is not limited.

Any skipper in the series race may also race as the skipper in the crew race that same day. However, her finish in the crew race will not be scored. It is the responsibility of that skipper, after her finish, to inform the on-the-water race committee that her score should not be registered.

## Start

The first warning signal will be at 1400 in the outer harbor.

## Courses

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather, the requests of classes, and the judgment of the race committee.

## Prizes

Daily prizes will be awarded after racing. Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Thursday Twilight Series

## **General**

Races for the J/22, J/24, J/80 and Shields classes are held each Thursday evening throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. Up to three series are held: June, July, and August. Two races are scheduled each evening for each class.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED unless the class decides to race without spinnakers.

## **Eligibility**

Races are scheduled for the J/22, J/24, J/80 and Shields classes.

Yachts listed in the current BYC Yearbook are entered automatically. All others shall file an entry form that can be found in Appendix C of this Guide.

## **Start**

The first warning signal will be at 1800 in the vicinity of Beverly Yacht Club Buoy “Y.”

## **Courses**

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather, the available light, and the judgment of the race committee.

## **Prizes**

Daily prizes will be awarded after racing. Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Saturday Series

## General

Races for the Shields, J/22, J/24, and J/80 classes are held Saturday afternoons throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar, unless specified under “Schedule” below. Up to three series are held: June, July, and August. Two races are scheduled each afternoon for each class, unless specified under “Schedule” below. The on-the-water race committee may, at its sole discretion, run a third race. However, only the scores of the first two races will count towards the series scores.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED. Shields class racers may use either the experimental or regular spinnaker per class rules.

## Eligibility

Races are scheduled for the Shields, J/22, J/24, and J/80 classes.

Yachts listed in the current BYC Yearbook are entered automatically. All others shall file an entry form found in Appendix C of this Guide.

## Schedule

Shields, J/22, and J/24 classes: In accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar.

J/80 class: Races will be scheduled on three Saturdays—June 11, July 23, and August 27. Multiple races are scheduled each day.

J/24 class Summer Series: Races will be scheduled on five Saturdays—June 11 and 18, July 9 and 23, and August 20.

Shields class Super Saturday: Races will be scheduled on Saturday August 27.

## Start

The first warning signal will be at 1400 in the outer harbor for the Shields, J/22 and J/24 classes. The first warning signal will be at 1200 in the outer harbor for both the J/80 class on its designated Saturdays and the J/24 class Summer Series. The first warning signal will be at 1100 in the outer harbor for the Shields class Super Saturday.

## Courses

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather, the requests of the classes, and the judgment of the race committee.

## Prizes

Daily prizes will be awarded after racing. Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Sunday Series

## **General**

Races for the Bullseye and H-12 classes are held Sunday afternoons throughout the season in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. Up to three series are held: June, July, and August. Two races are scheduled each afternoon for each class. The on-the-water race committee may, at its sole discretion, run a third race with spinnakers optional. However, only the scores of the first two races will count towards the series scores.

SPINNAKERS ARE NOT PERMITTED.

## **Eligibility**

Races are scheduled for the Bullseye and H-12 classes.

Yachts listed in the current BYC Yearbook are entered automatically. All others shall file an entry form found in Appendix C of this Guide.

## **Start**

The first warning signal will be at 1400 in the outer harbor.

## **Courses**

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather, the requests of the classes, and the judgment of the race committee.

## **Prizes**

Daily prizes will be awarded after racing. Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# **Sunday Spring and Fall Series**

## **General**

Races for the Laser, Bullseye, and H-12 classes are held on Sunday mornings in the spring and fall in accordance with the BYC calendar. Multiple series may be held in each season. Approximately five races are held each day for the Laser class and approximately four races for the Bullseye and H-12 classes.

## **Eligibility**

Races are scheduled for the Laser, Bullseye, and H-12 classes. All BYC members and non-members are eligible to race.

## **Race Management and Scoring**

BYC fully supports Spring and Fall racing with the use of small powerboats, marks, and club facilities for storage and launching. Race management and scoring will be the responsibility of individual fleets.

## **Start**

The first warning signal is scheduled for 1000 but may be changed at the discretion of the race committee.

## **Courses**

Courses will be at the discretion of the race committee.

## **Prizes**

Series and special prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Shields Guest Skipper Regatta

## General

The Shields Guest Skipper Regatta will be held in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. This event is a series of races on a Saturday in which the helmsman is a guest (as defined below) and the crew consists of additional guests, the owner and/or usual Shields crew. There will be up to four races scheduled.

SPINNAKERS (including the smaller experimental spinnaker) ARE PERMITTED

## Eligibility

The crew of each Shields shall consist of at least four persons. The helmsman for the entire race shall be an invited sailor who does not normally sail in Shields or a Shields crew member (non-related to the owner) who has not skippered a Shields. Owners who wish to participate shall be responsible for selecting a helmsman. Interested helmsman sailors should contact individual Shields owners or the Shields Fleet Captain in order to participate. *Yachts without a guest skipper are welcome to race but will not be eligible for prizes.*

## Start

There will be a mandatory skippers meeting at 0930 at the BYC on the day of the race. Helmsman eligibility shall be presumed settled at the Skippers meeting and thereafter is not grounds for protest. The first warning signal will be at 1100 in the outer harbor. There shall be no start after 1530.

## Courses

Around-the-buoys courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather and the judgment of the race committee.

## Scoring

If four races are completed one race may be thrown out as part of a yacht's score. One race will constitute a Regatta.

## Prizes

Regatta prizes (provided by Shields Fleet #10) for first, second and third will be awarded after racing at BYC.

# Racer-Cruiser Weekend Race

## General

The annual Racer-Cruiser Weekend Race will be held in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. This event offers point-to-point racing and performance cruising to PHRF and Cruising fleet members in a low-key, social atmosphere. This race is a pursuit race leading to an overnight cruising destination and festivities.

Information regarding the weekend's destination, format, schedule and activities will be distributed and posted on the BYC bulletin board at least three weeks prior to the event.

SPINNAKERS ARE NOT PERMITTED. ALL YACHTS MUST TOW A DINGHY.

## Eligibility

BYC and Marion PHRF fleet member yachts sailing under their PHRF-NE Cruising rating are eligible. Yachts without a PHRF-NE rating will be assigned a provisional rating for participation in this race. A special rating may be assigned by the Racer-Cruiser Committee, including age-related handicap bonuses of:

- +3 seconds/mile if the skipper is 65 or older
- +3 seconds/mile if the helmsman is 17 or younger

There is only one (non-spinnaker) division.

All boats shall submit an entry form, which can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. All yachts must comply with eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.)

## Entry Deadline

Entry forms and a valid PHRF-NE rating certificate or a provisional rating request must be received at the BYC Office by 1700 on the Thursday before the race. There is no entry fee.

## Start

The first warning signal will be at 1100 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G").

The race will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with subsequent starts being made in accordance with the flags and times prescribed on the scratch sheet.

## Finish

Finishing yachts are required to take their own finishing time, when the finishing buoy is 90 degrees abeam on the yacht's starboard side and within 25 meters. Each yacht shall report its finishing time to the race committee as soon as possible.

## Courses

A description of courses, starting times, and a list of yachts entered will be available at the BYC clubhouse at 0800 on the day of the race. The selected course will be posted on the course board of the race committee boat prior to the warning signal.

## Prizes

Winners will be recognized at the evening festivities following the race.

# Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy Race Day

## General

The Van Rensselaer Trophy Race Day is held annually and is scheduled in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. A pursuit race using the BYC handicap rule and special races for small one-design yachts (Bullseyes and H-12s) are held.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED.

## Eligibility

The pursuit race (the Van Rensselaer Trophy Race) is open to all single-hull Buzzards Bay yachts. No rating certificate is required.

Bullseyes and H-12s are eligible for the one-design races.

## Entry Deadline and Handicapping

The BYC Race Committee determines each yacht's handicap. Boats that have no valid handicapping certificate on file at BYC shall submit pertinent measurement data so that the Race Committee can assign a starting time. Note that Shields, J/80s, J/24s and J/22s race for the Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy under the BYC handicap system.

*All boats shall file an entry form for the Van Rensselaer Trophy Race.* Entry forms, measurement data and applicable fees must be received at the BYC Office by 1800 on the Friday immediately prior to the race.

Scratch sheets and starting times will be available at 0900 at BYC on the day of the race.

## Start

The start will be in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). Starting times for handicapped yachts will commence at 1200.

The Van Rensselaer Trophy Race will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with subsequent starts being made in accordance with the times prescribed on the scratch sheet.

The first warning signal for small one-design yachts (Bullseyes and H-12s) will be at 1400. Races will be started using RRS 26.

## Courses

The courses for all races will be as described on the scratch sheet or displayed on the committee boat.

## Prizes

The Van Rensselaer Trophy is awarded to the winner of the pursuit race. (A pursuit race has staggered starts and all yachts are handicapped to finish, in theory, at the same time.) The Thacher Family Trophy is awarded to the first Shields crossing the finish line in the Van Rensselaer Memorial Trophy Race. The Goodwin-Thacher Trophy is awarded to the winner in a race for Bullseyes on Van Rensselaer Day. The Mary C. B. Cumming Memorial Trophy is awarded to the winner in a race for H-12s on Van Rensselaer Day. Prizes and special awards will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Thayer Francis Moonlight Race

## General

The annual Thayer Francis Moonlight Race will be held in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. There is one race scheduled and an alternate date in case there is inclement weather on the first date.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED. Genoas ARE permitted for the Bullseyes. Single-handed sailing is NOT permitted.

## Eligibility

Races are scheduled for H-12s, Bullseyes, and J/24s. If any other one-design class wishes to participate, the Fleet Representative should contact the Race Committee in advance.

Yachts listed in the current BYC Yearbook are entered automatically. All others shall file an entry form, which can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. All yachts must comply with eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.) The person on board in charge shall be a BYC member.

## Entry Deadline

Entry forms and applicable fees must be received at the BYC Office by 1300 the day of the race.

## Special Rules

All yachts shall have aboard, in addition to their regular safety equipment and any equipment required by U.S. Coast Guard regulations:

Two flashlights	Compass
A paddle or oar	Anchor
Flares	VHF Radio

Participating boats may be inspected by the race committee for compliance with safety equipment requirements.

## Start

The first warning signal will be at 2100 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "8" (Fl R) in the harbor entrance.

## Courses

Around-the-buoys courses will be used. Distances will vary with the weather and the judgment of the race committee.

## Finish

The finish will be between Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "8" (Fl R) and Nye's Wharf. Any yacht not finishing shall notify the on-the-water race committee as soon as possible on VHF Channel 68.

## Prizes

Prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Parker Converse Tower Race

## General

The annual Parker Converse Tower Race will be held in accordance the BYC Racing Calendar. In even years, this is an overnight ocean race. In odd years, this is a daytime ocean race.

## Eligibility

This race is for single-hull PHRF yachts. All boats shall have proper offshore equipment. All boats shall submit an entry form, which can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. All yachts must comply with eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.)

The Tower Race is an ORC Category 4 event and all ORC equipment as noted in ISAF Special Regulations will be required, including lifelines. If you have any questions concerning compliance with Category 4, contact the PHRF representative on the Race Committee.

**PHRF Classes:** There will be PHRF Racing (Spinnaker) and PHRF Cruising (Non-Spinnaker) classes.

## Entry Deadline

Entry forms, applicable fees, and valid PHRF-NE rating certificates must be received at the BYC Office by 1700 on the day before the race.

## Start and Finish

The start will be in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). The finish will be at Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). If there is no race committee boat on station at the finish, the navigator of the finishing boat shall record her finishing time (GPS time) when close abeam of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). This time shall be reported to the race committee as soon as possible. The race committee will endeavor to hail the sail numbers of OCS boats on VHF channel 72. The race committee's failure to do so shall not be grounds for granting redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

**Overnight race (even years):** The first warning signal will be at 1800. **Daytime race (odd years):** The first warning signal will be posted prior to 1300 on the Wednesday before the event.

## Course

A yacht can choose to sail the Tower Race course in either direction:

(1) A yacht must first pass through Quick's Hole; round Lighted Gong G31 (Gay Head a/k/a Devils Bridge), leaving G31 to starboard; and then round Buzzards Bay Tower, leaving the Tower, Cuttyhunk, and Penikese Island to starboard,

OR

(2) A yacht must sail the course in reverse by first rounding Buzzards Bay Tower, leaving Cuttyhunk, Penikese Island, and the Tower to port; then round Lighted Gong G31 (Gay Head a/k/a Devils Bridge), leaving G31 to port; and then pass through Quick's Hole.

The RESTRICTIONS shown on the Bay Chart in the BYC Sailing Instructions apply.

## Prizes

Prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Championship of Champions

***PLEASE NOTE: This race is not scheduled in 2011.***

## **General**

The Beverly Yacht Club Championship of Champions will be held in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. The Race Committee will select the one-design class to be used for this event. Currently, these are Shields (2010), J/24s (2011), J/80s (2012), H-12s (2013), Bullseyes (2014). The owner or owner's representative may be aboard as a safety officer. The safety officer may act as crew, but cannot handle the helm, except in an emergency. The winner of the series shall be declared the BYC Champion of Champions and awarded the William G. Saltonstall Trophy.

Separate, special Sailing Instructions may be provided for this event.

**SPINNAKERS ARE NOT PERMITTED.**

## **Eligibility**

Eligible fleets are PHRF Racing and Cruising, Shields, J/80, J/24, J/22, Bullseye Thursday, Bullseye Sunday, H-12 Thursday, H-12 Sunday, and Laser. In the event the first place finisher is not available to attend the Regatta, the next place finisher shall be selected, and so on.

Each champion must select his or her crew from among those who regularly race in the fleet represented. The skipper (fleet champion) and crew shall be a BYC members.

## **PHRF**

The PHRF fleet may send two representatives to the BYC Championship of Champions race—one from the Spinnaker (Racing) Division(s) and one from the Non-spinnaker (Cruising) Division(s). These representatives will be selected using the results of five Twilight races in 2010: 6/16, 6/30, 7/14, 7/21, 8/4. One throw-out race will be allowed.

## **Shields**

The representative of the Shields fleet shall be the skipper who has the lowest total score in his/her best 10 races from the June and July Wednesday and Saturday Shields' series.

## **J/80**

The representative of the J/80 fleet shall be the skipper with the best combined score in the following races: Blue Shape One-Design Regatta, all of the June and July Saturday races, the Van Renssalaer Trophy Race, and Buzzards Bay Regatta. Van Renssalaer and BBR results shall be calculated using only the finishes of boats in the local J/80 fleet.

## **J/24s**

The representative of the J/24 fleet shall be the skipper with the best combined score in the June, July, and August Thursday Twilight Series. Any races after August 22 will not be counted.

## **J/22s**

The representative of the J/22 fleet shall be the skipper with the best combined score in the June, July, and August Thursday Twilight Series. Any races after August 22 will not be counted.

### Bullseye and H-12 Thursday

The representatives of the Bullseye and H-12 Thursday Ladies' Series shall be the skipper in each fleet with the best combined score in the skipper races in the June, July, and August series. Any races after August 22 will not be counted.

### Bullseye and H-12 Sunday

The representatives of the Bullseye and H-12 Sunday Series shall be the skipper in each fleet with the best combined score in the June, July, and August series. Any races after August 22 will not be counted.

### Lasers

The representative of the Laser fleet shall be the skipper with the lowest total score in the Sunday Spring Series.

### **Entry Deadline**

Fleet Captains shall notify the Race Committee Chairperson of their fleets' intent to participate and identify their champions by August 22<sup>nd</sup>.

### **Competitors Meeting**

The Race Officer of the event will conduct a competitor's meeting at 0800 hours on the day of the race. At that time, the format will be described and competitors will draw for boats. Boats will be equipped for racing, but competitors should provide their own life jackets, flags, and hand-bearing compasses. No competitor may race in his/her own boat unless competitors are required to rotate boats.

### **Start**

The first warning signal will be at 0900 in an area appropriate for the boats in the prevailing conditions. Races will be started using RRS 26.

### **Courses**

Either around-the-buoys or Olympic-type courses will be used.

### **Prizes**

The William G. Saltonstall Trophy is presented to the winner at Cups & Flags.

# Sou'wester Regatta

## General

The annual Sou'wester Regatta will be held in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar.

The Sou'wester Regatta is composed of two races:

- A pursuit race for yachts with PHRF-NE Racing ratings as well as Shields, J/80s, J/24s and J/22s that comply with class rules.
- A pursuit race for yachts with PHRF-NE Cruising ratings.

Races for small, one-design yachts (Bullseyes and H-12s) will also be held on the day of the Sou'wester Regatta.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED.

## Eligibility

The Sou'wester Regatta races are open to yachts in the PHRF Racing (Spinnaker), PHRF Cruising (Non-Spinnaker), Shields, J/80, J/24 and J/22 classes.

Bullseyes and H-12s are eligible for the one-design races.

## Entry Deadline and Handicapping

*All boats shall file an entry form for the Sou'wester Regatta.* Filing an entry is absolutely necessary to properly make race assignments and prepare the handicapping. The entry form can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. All PHRF yachts must comply with BYC eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.) Shields, J/80s, J/24s and J/22s must comply with their class rules and will be handicapped according to the PHRF-NE Base Handicaps.

Entry forms, applicable fees, and valid PHRF-NE rating certificates must be received at the BYC Office by 1800 on the Wednesday prior to the race. (Note: One-design yachts are not required to submit PHRF-NE rating certificates.) Questions concerning eligibility or handicapping should be directed to the PHRF representative on the BYC Race Committee.

There will be PHRF Racing (Spinnaker) and PHRF Cruising (Non-Spinnaker) races. Race assignments will be made based on the entries received by the entry deadline.

Scratch sheets and starting times will be available at 0900 at BYC on the day of the race.

## Start

The first warning signal for the PHRF classes will be at 1200 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). Races will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with subsequent starts being made in accordance with the times prescribed on the scratch sheets.

The first warning signal for one-design boats (Bullseyes, and H-12s) will be at 1230 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). Races will be started using RRS 26.

## Courses

The courses will be as described on the scratch sheet or displayed on the committee boat.

## Prizes

Prizes will be awarded at Cups & Flags.

# Hurricane Cup

## General

The annual Hurricane Cup race will be held according to the BYC Racing Calendar.

The Hurricane Cup is a pursuit race for yachts with PHRF-NE ratings. Shields, J/80s, J/24s and J/22s that comply with class rules may also compete in the Hurricane Cup.

Races for small one-design yachts (Bullseyes and H-12s) will also be held on the day of the Hurricane Cup.

SPINNAKERS ARE PERMITTED.

## Eligibility

The Hurricane Cup race is open to boats in the PHRF Racing (Spinnaker), PHRF Cruising (Non-Spinnaker), Shields, J/80, J/24 and J/22 classes.

Bullseyes and H-12s are eligible for the one-design races.

## Entry Deadline and Handicapping

*All boats shall file an entry form for the Hurricane Cup Race.* Filing an entry is absolutely necessary to properly make race assignments and prepare the handicapping. The entry form can be found in Appendix C of this Guide. All PHRF yachts must comply with BYC eligibility requirements. (See the BYC Racing Rules.) Shields, J/80s, J/24s and J/22s must comply with their class rules and will be handicapped according to the PHRF-NE Base Handicaps.

Entry forms, applicable fees, and valid PHRF-NE rating certificates must be received at the BYC Office by 1800 on the Wednesday prior to the race. (Note: One-design yachts are not required to submit PHRF-NE rating certificates.) Questions concerning eligibility or handicapping should be directed to the PHRF representative on the BYC Race Committee.

Scratch sheets and starting times will be available at 0900 at BYC on the day of the race.

## Start

The first warning signal for handicapped yachts will be at 1200 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). The Hurricane Cup race will be started in accordance with RRS 26 with subsequent starts being made in accordance with the times prescribed on the scratch sheet.

The first warning signal for small one-design yachts (Bullseyes and H-12s) will be at 1230 in the vicinity of Sippican Harbor Lighted Red Buoy "2" (Fl R) at Centerboard Shoal (BYC mark "G"). Races will be started using RRS 26.

## Courses

The courses will be as described on the scratch sheet or displayed on the committee boat.

## Prizes

Prizes will be awarded at Cups and Flags. Special prizes will be awarded immediately after racing.

## **Buzzards Bay Regatta**

This three-day regatta is held annually in August and is hosted in even-numbered years by BYC. In odd-numbered years, it is hosted by the New Bedford Yacht Club in Padanaram. Races are held for a variety of one-design and PHRF boats and will be scheduled in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar.

## **Beverly Yacht Club Junior Regatta**

This two-day regatta for Juniors is held annually at BYC and is scheduled in accordance with the BYC Racing Calendar. Registration material will be available from the BYC Junior Sailing Committee. A person is a Junior if his or her 19th birthday is after December 31 of the current year. For further information, contact the BYC Office.

## **US SAILING and Southern Mass Sailing Championships**

### **General**

Each year, Southern Mass Sailing ([www.southernmasssailing.com](http://www.southernmasssailing.com)) conducts a series of regattas which serve as quarter-final eliminations in the United States Sailing Association's National Championships. Winners go on to semi-finals at the New England level (NEYRC) which, in turn, sends winners to the National Championships.

### **Participation**

The BYC encourages members, both juniors and adults, to enter these challenging and exciting regattas. BYC provides entry fees and damage deposits and usually hosts at least one such regatta annually. Actual selection of participants can be determined up until the date of the scheduled event. Where appropriate, qualification races may be held by the Race Committee or Junior Sailing Committee to help in the selection of BYC participants.
